## The ALTE Introductory Course in Statistics for Language Testing


#### Abstract

ALTE is running a one-day Introductory Course in Statistics for Language Testing in Ljubljana, Slovenia, November 2019, prior to the ALTE 54 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Meeting and Conference. The course will be taught by Jane Lloyd, ALTE Validation Unit. The course is suitable for people who have a professional interest in language testing, including those working in small-scale testing operations. It is also suitable for teachers who would like to develop their knowledge and understanding of statistics in language assessment. Participants are not expected to have any detailed knowledge of the subject area. The course will have a practical focus.

- Practical Applications of Statistical Analysis

Some prior reading may be issued to participants before the course. It is highly recommended to bring own device/laptop to have a more dynamic experience of the course.
